Updates


Recruitment

- Associate PIs can be really useful in identifying patients, especially during out
 of hours so if sites are able to involve a trainee this could be helpful for recruitment.
- Where non-emergency patients are identified out of hours these patients can be flagged to the ProFHER-2 team for screening and consent on the next day they are available, engaging other staff at your site will be key to this.

Tips for using the PROFHER-2 Management System

- When you click 'Randomise', please click this button only once. Clicking multiple times may cause the system to return an error message.
- If you need to correct information prior to randomisation, please use the 'Go back' button at the bottom of the screen. Please **do not** use the back button in the browser as this can cause the system to return an error message.
- If when you click 'Randomise' the randomisation allocation does not appear
 or you receive an error message, please check your emails as the randomisation may have been completed and a confirmation of allocation sent accordingly.
- If the allocation does not appear in your emails or an error message occurs in the system which prevents you from proceeding to randomise, please contact a member of YTU staff (Catherine, Andrew, Moe, or Puvan). We will then work with you to rectify this issue.

Please **do not** try to randomise the participant again, contact a member of YTU staff. For further details please see the ProFHER-2 Trial Procedures Manual.
